STUDENT SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR 2021-22

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO DENVER (CU DENVER)

DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:



ALL DSF SCHOLARS (NEW, RENEWAL, TRANSFER):

Each DSF Scholar must complete and submit a DSF Retention Passport no later than November 5 for the Fall semester, and no later than April 8 for the Spring semester. All items will require a signature from the faculty and/or staff member in order to confirm student's attendance for each item. Incomplete passports submitted will not allow the student to meet the SSR.



The passport will include:

- Utilizing a campus resource
- Attend a CU Denver or DSF Sponsored Event focused on corporate engagement and/or career exposure opportunities.
- Attend at least 1 CU Denver Scholar Community Event per semester. Dates for Scholar Community Events will be provided at the beginning of each semester.
- SEED Students: meet with the SEED Transfer Contact



Scholars must meet the appropriate DSF Campus Contact at CU Denver:

- Freshman: Once a month
- Sophomore – Senior: Twice a semester



Students must complete CU Denver General Scholarship Application via ScholarLynx by March 1 each spring semester.

Student Support Programs

The Denver Scholarship Foundation wants every college student to successfully complete a college degree or certificate. Below are some helpful resources and programs that are available at CU Denver.

TRIO STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES (SSS)

Helps first generation, low-income students, & students with disabilities reach full potential & achieve success.

LYNX CREW

Mentoring services to support CU Denver undergraduate students in their first or second year at CU Denver. Students recruited to this program through newsletters, EOP awareness events, and referrals.

CU DENVER SCHOLARS PROGRAM

An early college enrollment program for college bound, high-achieving first generation students who enroll in college courses on campus during their senior year of high school.

INTERCULTURAL ENGAGEMENT CERTIFICATE

Designed to encourage student involvement in diversity workshop, cultural events, and other IEC certified gatherings. This certificate is an excellent way to get involved on campus, meet students from diverse backgrounds, and learn about other cultures.

CU DREAMERS

Empowers students to overcome adversity and appreciate adversity that is associated with being undocumented in the United States of America. Provides relevant experiences for students that will insure academic success, professional/personal growth, and social maturity.

PAL PEER ADVOCATE LEADERS

Promotes leadership for all students involved by matching undergraduate student leaders with first year students.

UNDERGRADUATE PRE-HEALTH PROGRAM (UPP)

Promotes leadership for all students involved by matching undergraduate student leaders with first year students.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS

EOP consists of American Indian Student Services (AISS), Asian American Student Services (AASS), Black Student Services (BSS) and Latin@ Student Services (LSS). EOP provides services to support underrepresented students and to promote a diverse and inclusive campus for all students, faculty, and staff.

SUMMER BRIDGE PROGRAM

A program designed to allow students who plan to attend CU Denver to get an early start by enrolling in courses, becoming acclimated with the campus and engaging with the community, as well as other activities.

CU DENVER CENTER FOR IDENTITY AND INCLUSION
